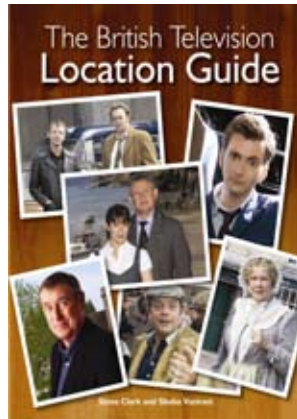

A fascinating new book reveals the secret filming locations for dozens of top television series and tells readers how they can visit the stunning locations they have seen so many times on the box.

From *Doctor Who* to *Spooks* and from *Cranford* to *Midsomer Murders*, **The British Television Location Guide** includes details of where all major British TV shows are filmed.

Written by Steve Clark, author of the bestselling *The Only Fools and Horses Story*, and television expert Shoba Vazirani, the book is a complete guide to what's filmed where and how you can visit the locations.

Among the 90 programmes included are current hits like *Doc Martin*, *Ashes to Ashes* and *Lark Rise To Candleford*, old favourites like *Only Fools and Horses*, *The Vicar of Dibley* and *Pride and Prejudice* and new series like *The Invisibles* and *Bonekickers*.

Television fans are fascinated by where programmes are filmed – and visiting the real locations is becoming increasingly popular but they aren't often easy to find - **The British Television Location Guide** makes visiting them simple.

Author Steve Clark hopes the book will encourage more people to explore the British countryside. "There are some stunning places in Britain and TV companies seem to have a knack of finding them," he says. "But they aren't always so quick in telling viewers where they are.

"So that's where **The British Television Location Guide** comes in. With many people feeling the pinch, visiting the location of your favourite television show is great day out because most of the places are completely free to see."

Co-author Shoba Vazirani says: "I'm sure many people have sat in front of their television sets and said: 'That place looks interesting. I wonder where it is?' Well now they can find out and if they want to, visit the locations of their favourite series."
